# RESOLUTION OF THE DUBIOS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS URGING THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO PLACE DUBOIS COUNTY AND MOST OF INDIANA IN THE CENTRAL TIME ZONE

WHEREAS, the Uniform Time Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. 260 et seq.) Delegates to the Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation the responsibility for designating standard time zone in the United States; and

WHEREAS, requests for changes in the designated time zones must be made by a local unit of government or a state government to the Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Dubois County, Indiana, request the Federal Department of Transportation to place Dubois County and most of Indiana, excluding the counties near the metropolitan areas of Louisville and Cincinnati, in the Central Time Zone; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Dubois County, Indiana, finds that it would be in the best interests of the citizens of Indiana and Dubois County, Indiana, to be located in the Central Time Zone; and

WHEREAS, evidence shows that 3 of the 4 school districts located in Dubois County, Indiana, would benefit greatly from a switch to Central Time Zone because they are members of athletic conferences whose members are primarly from the Central Time Zone (this holds true for academic contests as well); and

WHEREAS, all of Indiana is geographically located in the Central Time Zone.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of Dubois County, Indiana, that:

- 1. The United Stated Department of Transportation commence proceedings under the Uniform Time Act of 1966 to hold hearings in the appropriate locations in Indiana on whether or not all of Indiana should be located in the Central Time Zone, except for the counties in southeast Indiana that choose to remain in the Eastern Time Zone.
- 2. That the United States Department of Transportation find that it is in the best interests of Dubois County, Indiana, and the citizens of Dubois County, Indiana, that Dubois County be located in the Central Time Zone.

WHEREAS, the County Area of the proposed economic development area is contiguous with the City Area of the proposed economic development area; and


**WHEREAS**, I.C. 36-7-14-43 provides that an economic development area may be an allocation area for the purposes of distribution of property taxes.



# LEGAL DESCRIPTION 400W ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AREA

The 400W Economic Development Area and Tax Allocation Area ("the Area") is located in Section 28 and Section 29, Township 2 South, Range 5 West, Patoka Township, Dubois County, Indiana, the boundary of which is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of Section 28; thence Easterly 1,332 feet along the south line of the Section 28, to the southeast corner of the Carrico tract(Deed Record 2002005073 Office of the Recorder Dubois County), said corner being the Southeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 28; thence North 1,050.65 feet along the East line of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 28 to the south right-of-way line of the Norfolk Southern Railroad mainline; thence Northwesterly 1,456.44 feet along the south right-of-way line of the Norfolk Southern Railroad mainline to the Northeast corner of the Farbest Foods, Inc. tract(Deed Record Book 241 Page 378 Office of the Recorder Dubois County), said point also being on the west line of Section 28; thence, into Section 29, continuing Northwesterly 1,713.58 feet along the south right-of-way line of the Norfolk Southern Railroad mainline, said line also being the northwesterly line of the Farbest Foods, Inc. tract; thence South 5 degrees 23 minutes East 1,015.05 to the South line of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 29; thence North 89 degrees 16 minutes East 130 feet to an existing steel survey post marking the Southeast corner of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 29; thence, Southeasterly along the centerline of creek to its point of intersection with the East line of Section 29, said point being South approximately 360 feet of the Northeast corner of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 29 and said point also being the Southeast corner of said Farbest Foods, Inc. tract; thence Southerly 967.49 feet to the point of beginning, said boundary being 9,070.9 feet, more or less, and containing 71.3 acres, more or less, all of which lies within the corporate boundaries of the City of Huntingburg or within the area assigned to the City of Huntingburg by the Dubois County Redevelopment Commission, and in accordance with the drawing attached hereto.

WHEREAS, State and local jurisdictions who elect not to adopt the NIMS as part of the Local Emergency Operations Plan, will not be eligible for future funding by way of federal grants and disaster recovery dollars; and

WHEREAS, beginning October 1, 2004 all Federal departments and agencies shall make adoption of the NIMS a requirement, to the extent provided by law, for providing Federal preparedness assistance through grants, contracts or other activities to local governments;

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved that the County of Dubois adopt the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as its system of preparing for and responding to disaster incidents.
